MESSAGE FROM CO-FOUNDER/EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Just like that, another year has come and gone. Old School had some significant successes over the past year that are worth celebrating but we are also looking forward to expanding our reach and capacity by securing sustainable financial support. We are grateful for the generous donations and grants we have received to help us fulfill our mission and look forward to a variety of exciting upcoming opportunities.

In June 2022 Claire and I began performing *By the Sea*, a sensory play with music created for people living with dementia. We wrote the show based on stories we heard firsthand from seniors who grew up here in the province, next to the ocean. The funding from the New Horizons for Seniors Program allowed us to hire Jodee Richardson to record and edit the music for the show, which worked out better than we had even hoped, and it also allowed us to offer free performances, including two performances at City Hall with notable audience members such as the Seniors Advocate for the province, Susan Walsh, longtime supporter and former Member of Parliament, Jack Harris, and Deputy Mayor, Sheilagh O'Leary. Three days after these public performances, on July 28, Pearl Rouleau was born, and Claire stepped away from Old School to focus on new momhood.

In September we became officially licensed to run Music Together classes. So, in the fall, Claire (with Pearl) taught our first round of Music Together Generations classes for ages 0-5 with grand-friends at Cambridge Estates, and the winter session was taught by another Music Together teacher Meaghan Kennedy. Around the same time I was prepping for our Skill Sharing sessions funded by the Seniors Social Inclusion Initiative.



We were thrilled to have four very different skill sessions to offer the community. Sucseed led a session on hydroponics at Westbury Estates, Stacy Gardner inspired residents also at Westbury Estates with a creative writing workshop, James Hawksly amazed an intergenerational audience with magic and illusions, and Lindy Hop on the Rock introduced another intergenerational group to swing dancing. Claire, Pearl, and I successfully ran the Pen Pal Project again this year. We spent the fall with Leary's Brook Junior High and the winter with St. Theresa's. The grade sixes wrote to seven seniors homes across the city and after the cumulation of letters, they were able to meet face-to-face or virtually, depending on the home's Covid-19 protocols.

The biggest project (and headache) of all has been The Old School Bus retrofit. We had the bus painted, the lift installed, and insurance & and registration set up, and we learned there is nothing cheap about owning a bus! Eventually, we began gutting the interior with the help of Derek Winsor, Matt Strong, and Colleen O'Reilly. We hired someone to put in the new floor, install locks, etc. and this individual did not complete the work which left us in a difficult spot. Perry and Dave at City Wide agreed to help us out after hearing about the unfortunate experience and they fixed up damages and completed the job. Coming into the new year, we received a grant from the City of St. John's to finish the retrofit so it will be complete in 2023 -2024. It has been a year of slow successes. Our goal for the upcoming year is to find core funding and be able to employ ourselves and others so we can offer more meaningful programming and performances. We are very appreciative of every little bit of support.
